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Abstract:

Components in learning process activities include teachers, students, materials, strategies, methods, tools or media, and time. The task of preparing plans and implementing learning strategies requires the ability of the teacher. For this reason, teachers must have knowledge about learning strategies that will provide a scientific basis for how to organize and organize teaching and learning activities that can make it easier for students to learn so that learning goals are achieved in accordance with national education expectations or goals. Teachers are required to master extensive knowledge about education and a large number of professional skills in learning. In transferring grades, teachers are not only given in the form of lectures, but how teachers are creative in providing learning strategies to students, so that the learning atmosphere is not monotonous and students feel fun and do not get bored with the learning methods and strategies to use information technology media in their learning in order to provide the best for students in the future. Teachers are professional educators and their main role is to teach, educate and evaluate students in early childhood education, formal education, basic education and secondary education. Teachers as the main part of the world of education must be able to keep up with and even surpass the evolution of science and technology that is developing in society. Schools (education) must be able to develop scientifically and spiritually qualified human resources now and in the future.

In Islam, teachers are valued because they are knowledgeable, namely people who have the right to obtain a high and comprehensive level of life. From an Islamic perspective, teachers occupy an important position in forming a true Islamic personality in relation to patterns of teacher education and training. The success of the teaching and education of his people by the apostle then touches on aspects of the apostle's good behavior and example (Uswatun hasanah). (Tohiri, 2005). Therefore, the role of teachers in education is to develop students' personalities in learning at school (classroom). Teachers are the spearhead of this success in achieving the goals of character formation. Teachers as sponsors or imitators play an important role in implementing character education at school and outside school. As an educator, the teacher becomes a person from the child's perspective, and the teacher becomes a benchmark for students' attitudes. The national education system law stipulates that teachers must have good personality skills.

As part of character education, training is provided to train students to become people who do pious deeds based solely on their devotion to God. The concept of example in education is very important and can influence the educational process, especially in shaping children's moral, spiritual and social souls. To do this, teachers first need to get to know students personally. This can be done in such a way that the teacher first needs to recognize and observe the meaning that students bring at the beginning of the learning process. Second, teachers need to know the skills, opinions and experiences of their students. Third, recognition and understanding of students' actual situations as a basis for developing goals, objectives, methods and learning tools. As a professional, teachers need to put themselves in their place, namely as teachers and educators. In other words, it is necessary not only to impart knowledge, but also to educate and develop students' individuality through interactions inside and outside the classroom. Teachers must be given full rights (absolute rights) in assessing (evaluating) the learning process. Because when it comes to matters of student personality and personality, the teacher is the one who knows the situation and development best. Teachers have a dual role, namely as moderator, motivation, motivation and inspiration. (Tohiri, 2005)

Learning is an instructional system that refers to a set of components that depend on each other to achieve goals. As a system, learning includes components, including: objectives, materials, students, teachers, methods, and evaluation. The components of the learning strategy will be described below: (1.) Teacher. The teacher is the perpetrator of learning, so in this case the teacher is the most important factor.(2.) Pupils. Students are components who carry out learning activities to develop potential abilities into reality in order to achieve learning goals. (3.) Goals. Objectives are the basis used as a basis for determining learning strategies, materials, media and evaluation (4.) Study materials. Learning materials are a medium for achieving learning goals in the form of material that is arranged systematically and dynamically in accordance with the direction of the goals and development of scientific progress and the demands of society.

(5.)Learning activities. So that learning objectives can be achieved optimally, in determining learning strategies it is necessary to formulate learning activity components that are in accordance with learning process standards.(6.) Method. Methods are the methods used to achieve predetermined learning objectives (7.) Tools. The tools used in learning are everything that can be used to achieve learning objectives. (8.)Learning resources. Learning resources are anything that can be used as a place or reference where learning materials can be obtained.(9.)Evaluation. Evaluation is a component that functions to find out whether the goals that have been set have been achieved or not.

10. Environmental situation. The environment greatly influences teachers in determining learning strategies

The components of the learning strategy will influence the course of learning, because all of them are factors that influence the learning strategy. (Wina Sanjaya, 2006).Meanwhile, character itself is defined as character, disposition, psychological traits, morals or manners that differentiate a person from other people. Character is the values of human behavior related to God Almighty, oneself, fellow humans, the environment and nationality which are manifested in thoughts, attitudes, feelings, words and actions based on religious norms, law, etiquette, culture and customs. (Dimiyati and Mujiono, 2006). Character develops through the stages of knowledge, behavior and habits. However, personality is not limited to knowledge. The characters deepen and expand into the realm of their emotions and habits. Therefore, three elements of a good personality are needed as strategic steps that must be taken: moral awareness, empowering students' emotional side to become human personalities, and moral behavior. Character formation in an education system includes behavioral values that can be carried out or acted out in stages, and relationships between character components that are linked between knowledge of behavioral values and having strong attitudes or emotions to implement them. Almighty Allah, himself, fellow humans, and the environment. In order to achieve the goals of personality education, Islamic religious teachers, as individuals who are promoted or emulated, play an important role in implementing personality education in schools, so that they become pioneers of student success and personality education. As an educator, especially as a teacher of Islamic religious education, he will be a benchmark for student personality development.

As part of character education, training is provided to train students to become good people who are devoted only to God and do righteous deeds. The concept of role models in education is very important and can influence the educational process, especially in student characterization. For this reason, Islamic teachers must first identify their students personally.

This, on the other hand, can be achieved by Islamic teachers who recognize and pay attention to student movements and understanding at the beginning of the learning process. Both PAI teachers need to know the skills, opinions and experiences of their students. Third, introduction and understanding of students' actual conditions as a basis for Islamic religious educators to develop objectives, guidelines, methods and learning materials.
